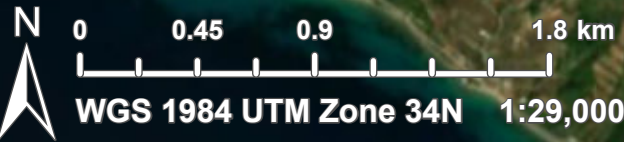
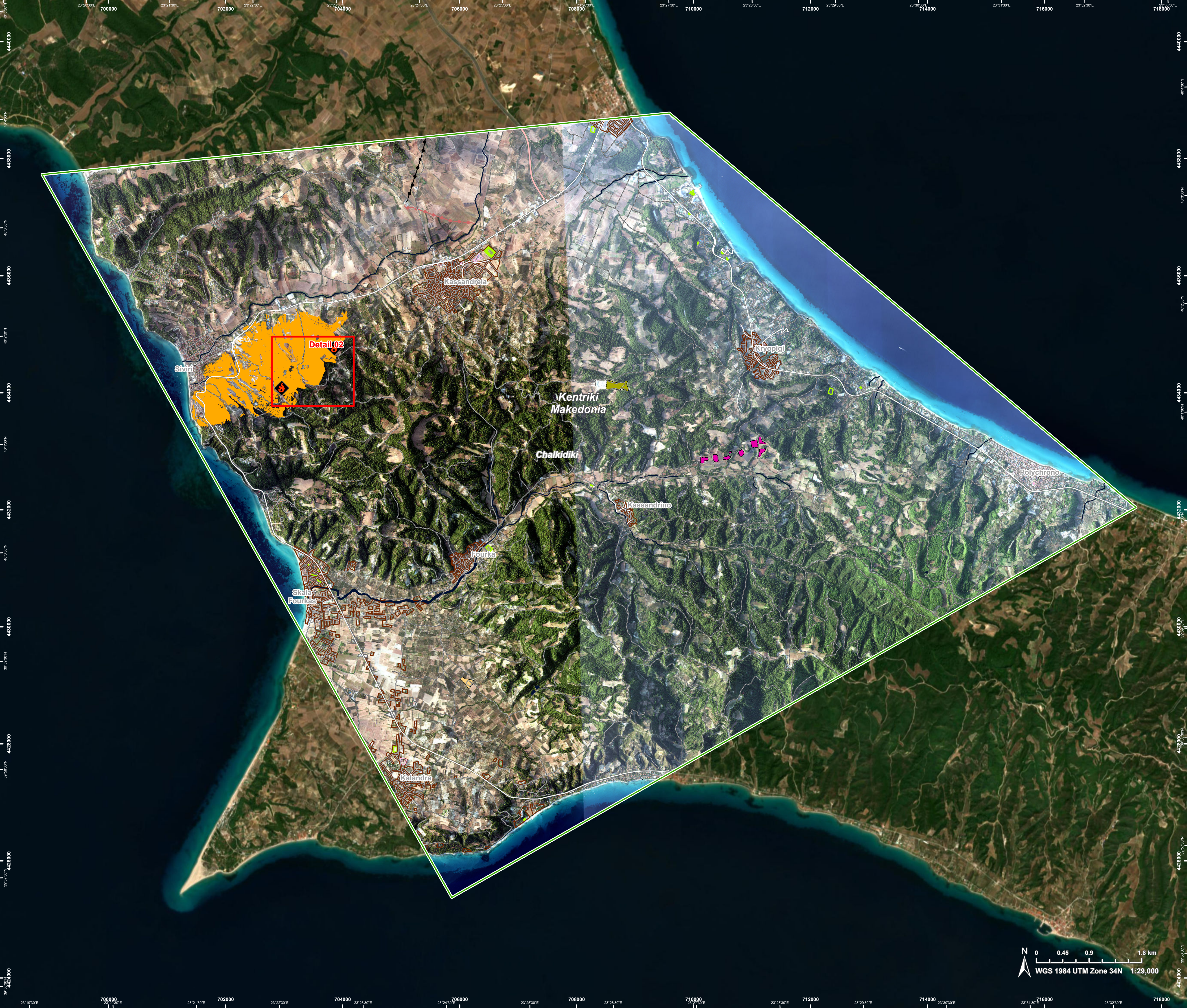
Event: On 13 August 2026 at 12:00 CET, a wildfire started in the Chalkidiki Regional Unit of the Central Macedonia Region, Greece, near the village of Siviri. The event is ongoing and rapidly developing. The residents of Siviri and Fourka have been evacuated, while more than 170 firefighters and 15 aerial assets are involved in suppression operations, supported by municipal machinery and volunteer organisations. Copernicus EMS Rapid Mapping is requested to provide initial rough estimation, fire extent and damage assessment emergency mapping.

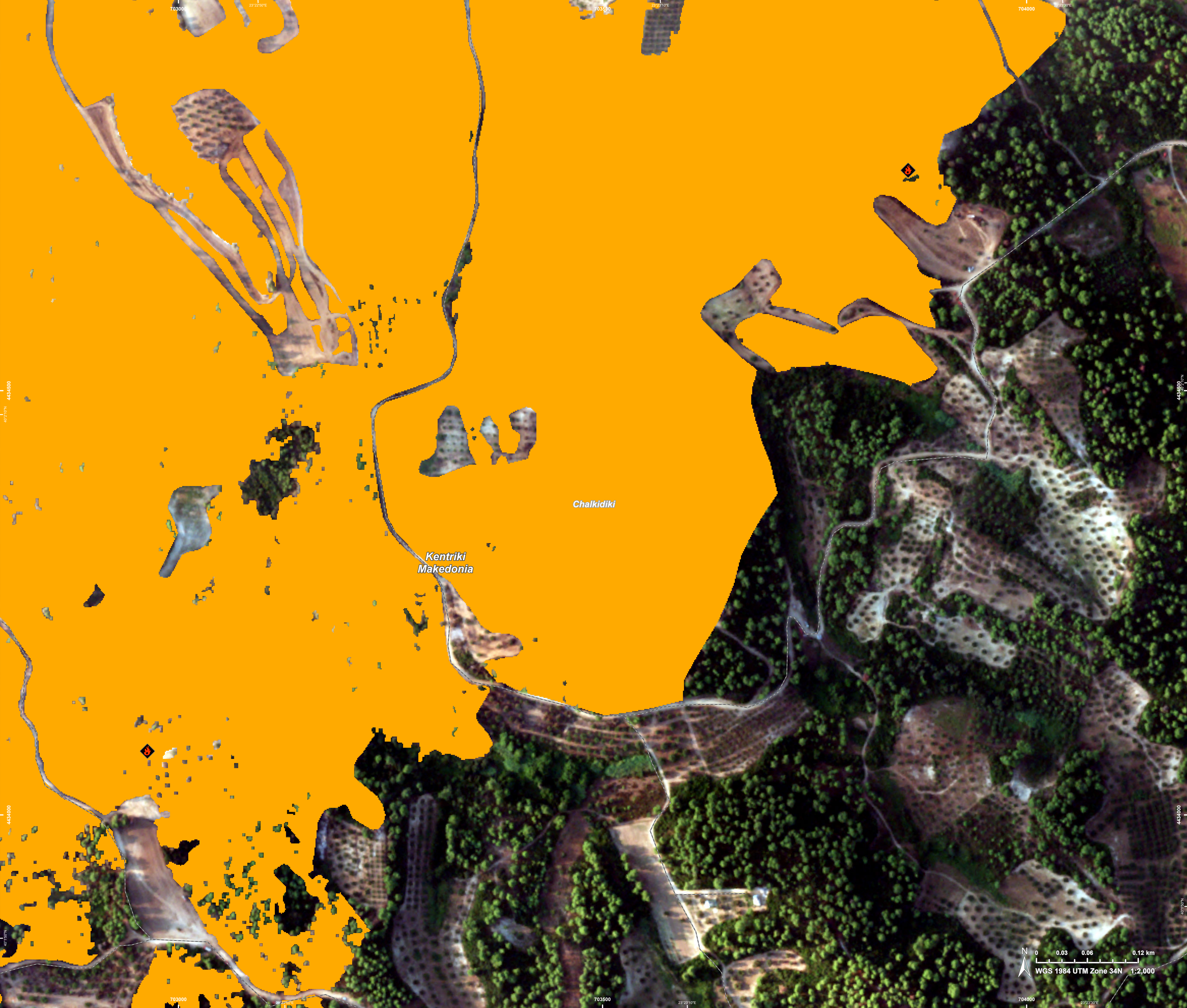
